


FIRST TEN AMENDMENTS



1ST AMENDMENT

Protects freedom of:

• R - Religion

A – Assembly

• P - Petition

• P – Press

· S - Speech





2ND AMENDMENT

Right to Bear Arms.



3RD AMENDMENT

Protects against quartering of soldiers.



4TH AMENDMENT

• Protects against unreasonable search and seizure.



· Right to remain silent and protects against double jeopardy.



The right to a speedy trial.



Protects against excessive fines and cruel punishments





10TH AMENDMENT

States Rights



BILL OF RIGHTS

1st Amendment: Freedom of religion, speech, press, assembly and the right to petition their government.

2nd Amendment: Right to bear arms.

3rd Amendment: Government cannot Quarter soldiers in private homes.

4th Amendment: Protects against unreasonable searches

5th Amendment: Protects against self-incrimination and double jeopardy.

6th Amendment: rights of the accused

7th Amendment: ensures trial by jury

8th Amendment: No excessive fines or cruel punishments.

9th Amendment: Other rights retained by the people.

10th Amendment: reserves powers not granted to the federal government to the states and the people.
