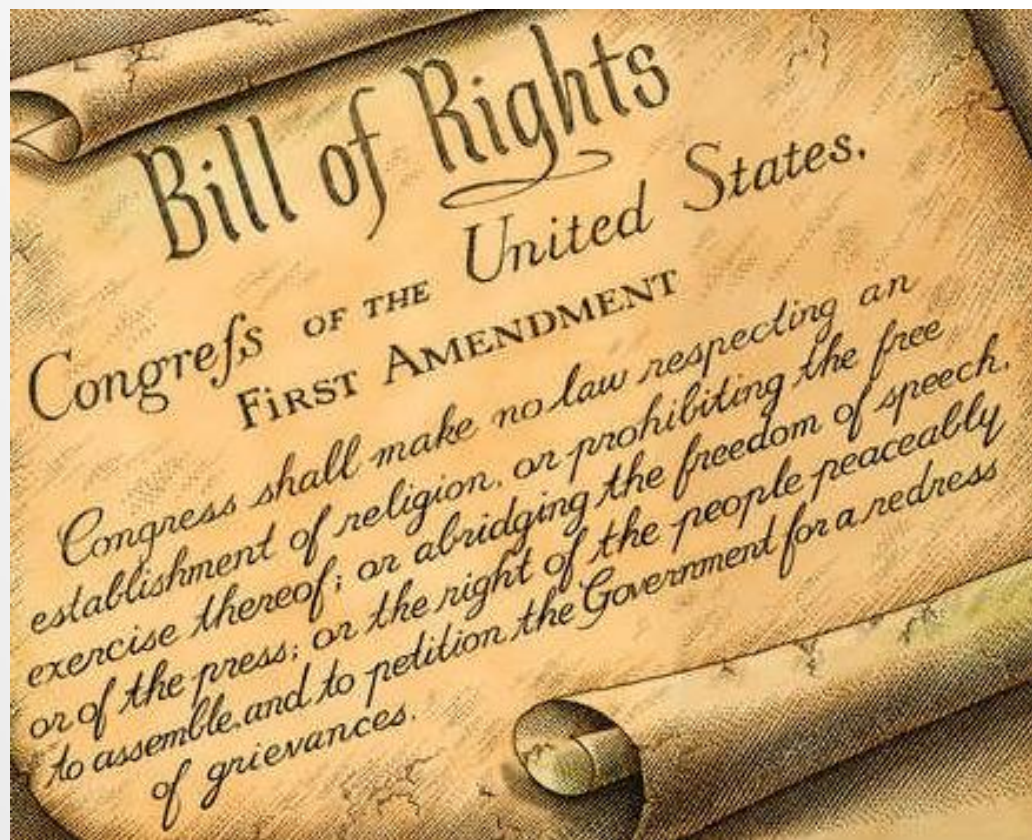

# 1<sup>ST</sup> AMENDMENT

- Protects freedom of:

- R – Religion
- A – Assembly
- P – Petition
- P – Press
- S – Speech

- Right to Bear Arms.



# 3<sup>RD</sup> AMENDMENT

- Protects against quartering of soldiers.



# 4<sup>TH</sup> AMENDMENT

- Protects against unreasonable search and seizure.



# 5<sup>TH</sup> AMENDMENT

- Right to remain silent and protects against double jeopardy.



# 6<sup>TH</sup> AMENDMENT

- The right to a speedy trial.

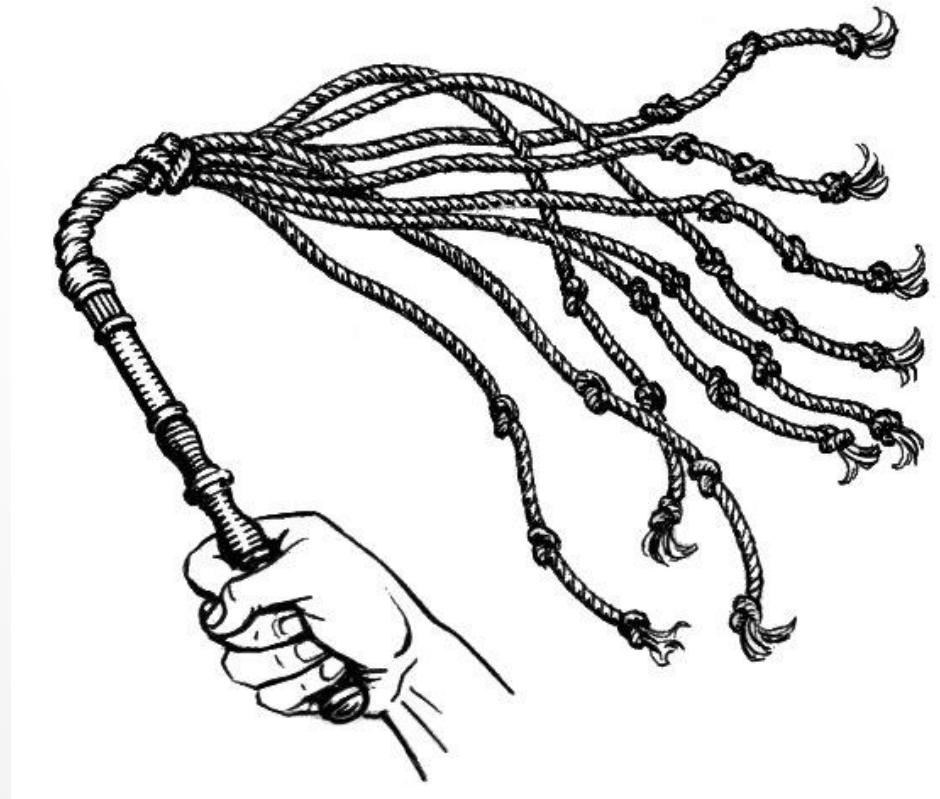
# 7<sup>TH</sup> AMENDMENT

- Protects against excessive fines and cruel punishments



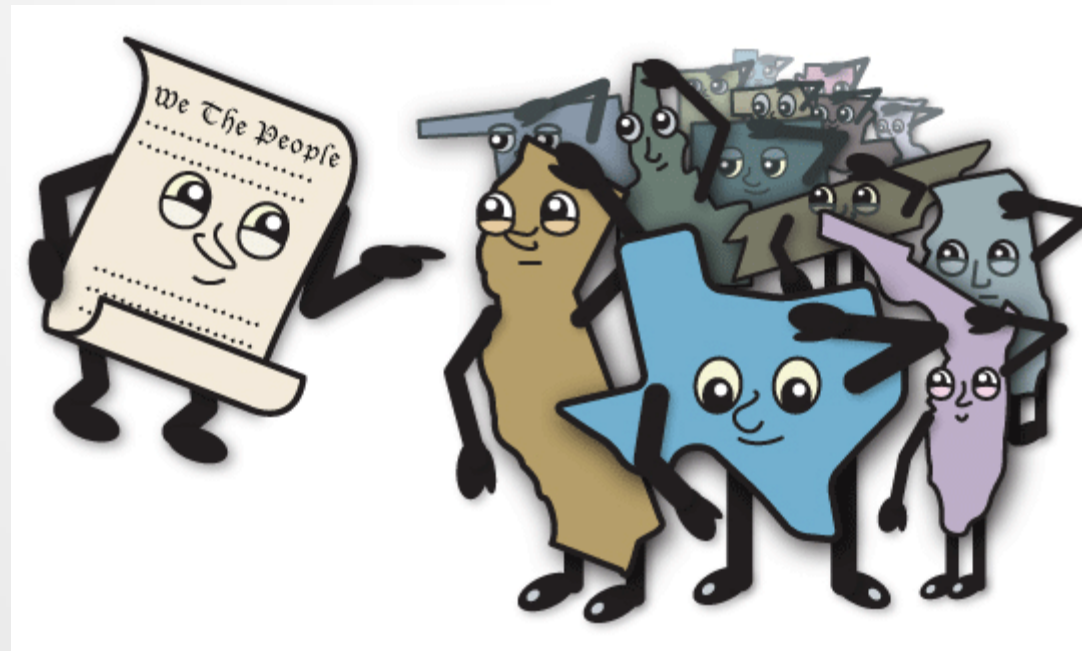
# 9<sup>TH</sup> AMENDMENT

# BILL OF RIGHTS

1<sup>st</sup> Amendment: Freedom of religion, speech, press, assembly and the right to petition their government.

2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment: Right to bear arms.

3<sup>rd</sup> Amendment: Government cannot Quarter soldiers in private homes.

4<sup>th</sup> Amendment: Protects against unreasonable searches

5<sup>th</sup> Amendment: Protects against self-incrimination and double jeopardy.

6<sup>th</sup> Amendment: rights of the accused

7<sup>th</sup> Amendment: ensures trial by jury

8<sup>th</sup> Amendment: No excessive fines or cruel punishments.

9<sup>th</sup> Amendment: Other rights retained by the people.

10<sup>th</sup> Amendment: reserves powers not granted to the federal government to the states and the people.
