* 18th Amendment

Passed in 1920

Prohibition → Banning the sell, manufacturing, or transportation of Alcohol.

Why the amendment passed

Drunkenness was a threat to the nation

Elimination of alcohol believed to eliminate poverty, immoral behavior, and violence

Unintended effects of prohibition

Speakeasies - underground drinking establishments.

Bootlegging - Transporting Alcohol illegally

* Organized crime increased

Weak enforcement of laws

Gambling

Prostitution

Moon Shine - Illegally Produced Alcohol (High proof liquor)

Why was prohibition repealed?

Great Depression (it was believed that not selling/manufacturing alcohol was preventing workers to get jobs)

Americans Against Prohibition Association

FDR election platform was to repeal prohibition

* 21st Amendment

1933 Repealed / Reversed Prohibition (18th Amend)

FLAPPERS AND WOMEN IN THE 1920S

Appearance:

- Short and straight flowy skirts, often sleeveless
- Short, bob haircuts
- Makeup
- Heels
- Drank and smoked cigarettes

Actions

- Went out to speakeasies.
- Listened and danced (the Charleston) to jazz music.
- Worked outside the home

- *Much more promiscuous*
- *Much more assertive and had open debates with men.*

Impact

- Increased consumerism
- Brought more independence for women
- pushed barriers in economic, political and sexual freedom for women.
- *Alot of People did not like some of the loosening of moral values and Pushed back.*
